	rock is currently stockpiled, not in final position,	
	along the beach. Placement has begun next to the	
	pier. Offloading will begin again tonight.

	Bay 2 and 3 is where rock is unloaded, bay 1 is where	
	it is currently being placed for the rock revetment.

	safety. This is to reduce the risk of injuries from flying shards of rock which sometimes happen when	
	rock is being placed. The barriers prevent members	
	of the public looking over the seawall.
